A MESSAGE FROM FATHER HEPNER

Dear parishioners,

If I asked what your best attribute is, what would you say? What about someone you love? His laugh. Her strong will. His sense of peace under pressure. Her vulnerability. But what if you asked *God* what his favorite attribute about himself is? His love? His beauty? His omnipotence? Jesus told St. Faustina, "Proclaim that *mercy* is the greatest attribute of God."

St. John Paul II proclaimed, "As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!" On this Divine Mercy Sunday we encounter Christ who passes through doors locked out of fear and shame, and who stands revealing his glorified wounds, ready to bless, forgive, and give peace. "Shalom," he says to them, as if to say "May all the broken pieces of your life, shattered by sin, come together into something more perfect than they were before."

I believe God wanted me to continue these articles on human love on Divine Mercy Sunday. There is a category of sin which causes us, like the apostles in the upper room and Adam and Eve who hid in shame, to cover ourselves in darkness and try to hide from God. Those sins have to do with human intimacy: Adultery, impurity with oneself, and impure content through media all cause immense shame. And sometimes a person experiences shame over sins that others perpetrated on them.

When we choose to commit a sin, we harm or break our communion with God. Guilt, like physical pain, is a sign that something is wrong in our soul and our relationship with God. Yet God doesn't want us to hide from him and remain in the darkness. Like the prodigal son who took his father's blessings and squandered them, only to find himself eating pig slop, we too can take the gift of sexuality and use it outside of God's plan only to find that the world doesn't satisfy. It only has pig slop to offer. But our Father's house has a rich, delicious meal, and he is ready to embrace us and restore us to life if we simply move our hearts toward him. And if you are a victim, God the Father certainly does not want you to blame yourself and live in silence. Like the voice of

Able crying from the ground, he wants you to speak up and be heard by those who can help.

Unfortunately, carnal sins are celebrated and enabled through technology by a culture that does not care who it hurts. The average age of exposure to impure images is between 8 and 10. Those who expose these young children are certainly the ones of whom Jesus said it would be better for them to have a millstone tied around their neck and tossed into the sea (Luke 17:2). The effects of these images on the brain and body are horrendously powerful, short-circuiting the built-in "wiring" that God created in us for human connection, causing shame and curiosity, and often getting them "hooked" as if on a drug.

It is not enough simply to assume that the children in our lives wouldn't look for this sort of thing. It is looking for them. There is immense profit in this industry — an industry which literally enslaves people for money and doesn't care about your children's soul. But thankfully there are many wonderful resources. **I beg every adult reading this to go online to integrityrestored.com**, a faithful Catholic website that is filled with up-to-date content, and click on at least one of the circles that applies to you or those you love: "Men/Women," "Couples," "Parents," "Youth/YA."

I wish we didn't have to fight this fight. I wish the world were simpler. But we were chosen for this time, and every one of us has a responsibility to respond, innocent as a dove yet wise as a serpent, to one of the most insidious tools of Satan. Like a sharp scalpel, this tool is used to cut through a person's relationship with God and cause them to doubt his love and mercy. For those who have formed a habit, this website, along with bringing the temptation into the light, are tools of God's mercy that can help free you forever. I feel a special mission in my life to walk with people of any age and either gender to help them to be free from lust. Have the courage to bring it to Jesus in the confessional, who never turns away from us. And, pray for the even greater courage to meet with me and form a plan for freedom. Because God is "rich in mercy" (Ephesians 2:4). It's his greatest attribute. And he wants to prove it to you!


